Brief Description

This course is designed for students with no previous knowledge of French. It's an introductory study of the language which focuses on developing the basic communication, vocabulary, pronunciation and grammar skills at an elementary level, both in written and spoken French. This course introduces the reading of short texts and provides listening practice to enable students to deal with everyday situations, as well as to develop knowledge and understanding of French cultures and societies.
