Brief Description

Following the course FRN 1A1 Introductory French I, this course is designed for students with certain prior knowledge of French by providing continued intensive study of the French language. The main focus of this course is on language acquisition and the development of language skills. In addition, these language skills will be developed through the study and use of a range of written and spoken materials.

Learning Results

Having successfully completed this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Construct simple conversational sentences with assigned topics like traditions, family, health, environment and etc;
- 2. Use correct forms of French verbs, including infinitives, imperfect (imparfait), pluperfect (Plus-que-parfait), passé simple, future tenses and conditional forms;
- 3. Correctly use the forms and orders of adjectives and adverbs, as well as nouns and demonstrative pronouns;
- 4. Read and comprehend short passages and answer the associated questions based on the readings;
- 5. Write two grammar-error-free compositions, 150 words and 300 words, respectively;
- 6. Demonstrate basic knowledge of francophone cultures and French literature.
